General Information about the School

St Theresa's Primary School is a beautiful, friendly school at the heart of the Glebe, a semi-rural area which is located in the Parish of Sion Mills and to the north west of the town itself. The school is minutes away from Strabane and our children also travel from many of the surrounding villages, making our school an ideal location for parents. The distinctive ethos of St. Theresa's is that everyone feels welcomed and belongs here.



The current building of St Theresa's opened in March 1987 and in 2017, the school marked its 30th year anniversary. The building still remains in excellent condition.

St Theresa's has five classrooms, wet areas, computer cluster and a dining room/multifunctional hall. A new staffroom and offices were added in 2003. A portable classroom is located at the rear of the school and is used as an extra resource area. The school has two tarmacked play areas and the use of a MUGA pitch, the school grounds are beautifully maintained and over the years each cohort of children has had a lot of input, planting trees, shrubs and bushes.

During the last few years, St Theresa's has added and improved its provision with the following facilities:

- A Sensory room
- A state of the art outdoor play area
- A pollinator garden
- A fabulous outdoor classroom
- Top of the range ICT equipment
- Polytunnel to complement our upper gardening area
- New exterior fencing and gates to secure the boundary of St Theresa's grounds
- Brand new girls' toilets
- Ramps and improved pathways for children with disabilities.


Extra-Curricular Provision

A Typical School Day

- **Breakfast Club** starts the day off at 8:30am Every child is welcome to attend.
- School doors open at 8:45am for our remaining pupils
- Class begins at 9:00am
- Morning break is from 10:30am to 10:45am for Primary 1-4 pupils
- Morning break is from 10:45am to 11:00am for Primary 5-7 pupils
- Primary 1 3 children finish their school day at 2:00pm. However, 2-3 Wrap Around Club is available for children to stay on to 3pm daily. £2 per day.
- Primary 4 7 pupils finish at 3:00pm each day. Various after schools' clubs run at regular stages throughout the year.
